In a single year, 19,089 members borrow 129,201 traditional and electronic items. 29,800 people visit our 12 library branches and **45,812** people access virtual program and services. The public access computers are utilized 2,050 times and the free wireless is accessed **2,350** times. Audiobooks, e-books, music, and films are downloaded 114,570 times. Librarians are asked 3,000 reference questions plus 3,200 reader advisory questions and receive 1,800 requests for technology assistance.
